During the month of April, we will explore the changing weather as we welcome the beautiful spring season. We will discuss how the weather is getting warmer and introduce the saying, "April showers bring May flowers."

Children will learn about how rainbows are formed and introduced to the four main types of clouds. We will also begin exploring the concepts of living and non-living things.

Our class will enjoy songs about spring, flowers, and nature while learning about plants and insects that emerge during this season. As a hands-on science activity, the children will observe the germination process by placing lima beans in clear plastic bags with moist cotton. They will place them in sunlight and watch as the seeds begin to sprout.

We will also learn about the signs of spring, including the chirping of birds, and explore different types of birds. The children will create booklets to learn about the parts of a bird and will participate in activities such as making bird feeders.

On April 3rd, we will celebrate with a fun Easter egg hunt, along with creative activities such as making Easter bunnies and decorating eggs.

On Earth Day, April 22nd, we will focus on caring for our planet by learning about reducing, reusing, and recycling. We will also discuss ways to conserve water and energy, such as turning off lights and closing doors when heating or air conditioning is in use. Gardening activities will be encouraged to help children connect with nature.
